
Phil Lumsden


Prudence Rothwell

By building Australia's first fully licensed commercial mobile abattoir, for the first time animal welfare and meat quality didn't have to be compromised by the necessity of live transport. Requiring laws to be changed in Victoria, Provenir has forged a new path in livestock processing that not only creates better quality meat but aligns with farmers welfare commitments. Chris is a scientist turn farmer, and now butcher that is leading the red meat industry for the better.

He is an enthusiastic proponent of using the HM process to regenerate land while building a financially resilient business.
